**FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK**

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members

**Parent /Teacher Interviews - Early Close Tuesday, April 4<sup>th</sup>**

I encourage all parents to take this opportunity to meet with teachers for an update on their child's progress and start to the school year. **Students will be released at 11:30am** on this day, so teachers can conduct interviews commencing at 12pm and concluding at 5pm. We request parents book an interview time with class and specialist teachers, by entering their name in an available timeslot on the sign-up sheets that are located outside classrooms, by emailing, phoning the school office or sending a booking request through Skoolbag online. A flyer detailing Skoolbag installation instructions is available from the front office.

*Children who are unable to be collected at 11:30am will be supervised by staff until 2:45pm.* If your child/children will be remaining at school after 11:30am, please complete the return slip in this newsletter, see page 8. Our onsite out of school care provider, Helping Hands, will be operating from 11:30am, providing activities for children enrolled in their program. They will also provide a free tea and coffee service from the Canteen for parents who are waiting for interviews. All interviews will be held in classrooms or specialist areas and timed for 12 minute discussion time, with 3 minute changeovers. If parents are unable to attend this session, or more in-depth discussion is required, an alternative meeting date needs to be arranged with teachers.



**School Uniform Change**

To commemorate Bannister Creek Primary School's 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the School Board has endorsed a change to the school polo shirt. It was intended that the new shirt would be phased in at the beginning of 2018, however, Willetton Uniforms have had a surge in polo shirt sales and now report that stocks of the current polo are low or sold out in some sizes. Therefore, the new shirt will be phased in early Term 3. Both Polo shirts will be in our school dress code. The new shirt's material is a cotton backed mesh and has a UV protection rating. It will cost \$26.

### IMMUNISATION INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Immunisation programs in our community are designed to keep everyone well and safe, especially those people who are most at risk, such as babies.

Parents or legal guardians who do not immunise their child should note the following:

◆ In the case of a measles or Pertussis (Whooping Cough) outbreak, Western Australian schools are required by the Department of Health, to exclude students who have not received the appropriate vaccination.

Please make sure that your school aged child is fully immunised and that you have provided a copy of the ACIR immunisation record to your school.

Did you know, that as parents you can phone the National Registry or go to the website to check out your child's immunisation status? All you need is your Medicare number. ## NO NUTS RAW BALLS

### Ingredients

50g Sunflower Seeds  
50g Pumpkin Seeds  
50g Desiccated Coconut (+ a little extra for rolling)  
159g Cranberries (or any combination of dried fruit)  
1-2 TBs Cacao Powder (optional, you may need to add a tablespoon of rice malt syrup to balance the bitter of the cacao)



### Method

1. Blend all ingredients together in a food processor.
2. Roll into small balls then roll in extra coconut.
3. Place in a container and refrigerate to set.

*Recipe makes 10-12 and will keep for 2-3 weeks in the fridge. Can be frozen.*
