Defibrillator on School Site

Our P&C have been successful in applying for a Lotterywest Heart Grant. This is great news for our school and the community, as Bannister Creek Primary School is now registered as a Community First Responder (CFR) location and we have a defibrillator installed outside the front office door. The defibrillator is installed on an external wall of the school to enable community access 24/7.



How the CFS system works:

- . A person suffers a sudden cardiac arrest.
- . Bystanders call triple zero (000).
- . An ambulance is dispatched.
- . The Communications Officer will advise the caller where the closest Community Defibrillator is located - enabling them to provide critical assistance prior to the arrival of the ambulance.
- . An ambulance arrives and paramedics take over the care of the patient.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on school students with Disability (NCCD) is an annual process participated in by all Australian schools across the country. The aim of this process is to provide the Australian Government with consistent information about the number of students with disability in Australian schools and the type of adjustments they require in order to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students. From 2018, the NCCD has been used by the Australian Government to inform funding for schools, known as the 'student with disability loading'.

Students at Bannister Creek Primary School will be included in the NCCD only if they require ongoing adjustments at school due to a disability as defined by the Disability Discrimination Act. This is a very broad definition of disability, which includes physical and intellectual disabilities, learning disorders such as dyslexia and dysgraphia, and mental health conditions such as anxiety and depression.

At Bannister Creek Primary School the Learning Support Coordinator (LSC) and Student Services Team Deputy Principal, moderate and consult each disability student's teacher to ensure we provide accurate information to the Australian Government. All names and information are kept confidential.

No actions are needed by parents, but if you do have any questions, please see Cheryl Rooney our LSC or Paige Goodsell (SST DP) for more information.

Move from Skoolbag to Connect

Due to recent changes by the company that provides access to the Skoolbag communication App, we are no longer able to provide communication to our school community through this service. The school has made the decision to use the Department of Education supported **Connect** service. **This change will be effective from the beginning of Term 3, Monday 22nd July.**

Connect is a secure online environment developed by the Department of Education for staff, students and parents in public schools. For you, **Connect** provides easy access to information relevant to your child's classes and learning such as assessments, teacher feedback and attendance data.

Schools can use **Connect** to keep you updated with important information. Things like up-coming events, excursions, classroom activities, photos and stories can be send to you via email or, if you prefer, via a push notification on your phone.

STUDENT HEALTH

It has come to our attention that there has been a high number of cases of Conjunctivitis in the school.

Conjunctivitis, or 'pink eye', causes redness and swelling of the outer layer of the eye and inside the eyelid. It can also cause sore and watery eyes, with a yellowish discharge. Conjunctivitis spreads through contact with the discharge from an infected eye, nose or throat.



If you notice any symptoms in your child, please seek treatment from a doctor or chemist as soon as possible. Your child should be kept at home until symptoms are gone to prevent it from spreading to other students.

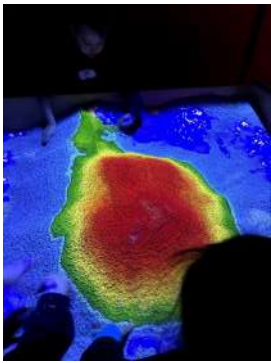
2019 PANDA'S PICNIC

COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSE NEWS

Bedwetting, or nocturnal enuresis, is very common in children. Bedwetting has nothing to do with dreaming, and children who wet the bed are not 'just being lazy'.

If your child wets the bed, there are a number of things you can do to help, such as using a waterproof mattress cover and establishing a before-bed routine. It is not helpful to punish children who wet the bed. Fluids should not be restricted, even before bedtime. Sugary or caffeinated drinks should be avoided.

If your child is still wetting the bed after five and a half years of age, seek help through a referral by your local doctor. A bedwetting alarm is an effective and safe method of treatment available for nocturnal enuresis and may be appropriate for your child. Nocturnal Enuresis clinics are located in Parkwood, Armadale, Atwell, East Fremantle, Kwinana and Mandurah.
